#### Pastor's Note:

I was recently interviewed by MC Canada for an article about MC Canada's financial dearth. [Here is the link to the article: http://news.mennonitechurch.ca/pastor-concerned-about-financial-health-wider-church ]

I am troubled by the reduction of ministries because of the shrinking support for both MC Canada and MC Saskatchewan. However, just as I'm concerned about the vitality of both of these fine extensions of our church, I am as much or more alarmed about the response and the reasons for the decreasing funds. The requests to increase contributions are anchored to a sense of loyalty and dedication to the organizations, and both provide sound services. Yet, I wonder if we have neglected to focus on the real purpose of why we are organized, including the spiritual aspect, too.

We are the church. We are the body of Christ, and putting money in the offering bag should not be to sustain an organization, regardless of what it's called. Learning to give, to completely release ownership, is part of our spiritual journey. The Sunday offering is an opportunity to give to God, and our giving is a reflection of our love and our trust in God. The purpose of the church (local, provincial and national) is to do the will of God, and that is not dependent on the bottom line of a financial statement. God will enable and empower what God leads us to do. To be sure, I don't think God calls us to be reckless and wasteful.

As individuals, we must regularly ask God, "What amount or percentage do you want me to give to you?" As a church, we must constantly seek God's leading for our ministries, and this includes the extensions of the local Mennonite church--MC Canada and MC Saskatchewan. Moreover, there are numerous excellent charitable organizations, worthy of support, but they are not the church. When we embrace why we do what we do and who we are giving our money to, then we will not have to worry about the limitations of money.

#### Mennonite Church Canada – Ministry Highlights

What does Mennonite Church Canada have to do with ministries like Mennonite Central Committee (MCC) or Mennonite Disaster Service (MDS), or even the soup kitchen down the street? Quite a lot, actually. Mennonite Church Canada builds the foundation for the good work they do by building people of faith.

These ministries and others like them rely upon the hands, feet and hearts of people – often volunteers – who are dedicated to working for peace and justice, caring for creation, healing relationships with Canada's First Nations, and extending compassion and hospitality to newcomers and those of other faith traditions. Many of them draw their convictions from deep roots in Jesus Christ that have been nurtured by God's gift of the church.

Mennonite Church Canada is a church-building, faith-nurturing body, a community of over 225 congregations represented by five area churches: Mennonite Church Eastern Canada (MCEC), Mennonite Church Manitoba (MCM), Mennonite Church Saskatchewan (MC Sask), Mennonite Church British Columbia (MCBC). This family is building a capacity to support three priorities that connect in an evergrowing circle.

The many ways in which we minister together are not as immediately visible as on-the-ground responses to the social justice issues or national disasters that make media headlines, but they are making a difference. Read on to discover a few of the many ways that you have helped to grow people and communities for God in 2012.

In 2012, Mennonite Church Canada shared resources with over 220 churches and thousands of individuals across the country, providing timely and relevant materials to inspire services, church leadership resources, and organized a variety of events that brought people face-to-face for discussion, growth and fellowship, all with the objective of shaping people who will play an active role in building God's Kingdom.

- Mennonite Church Canada distributed 10 issues of Equipping to each of our congregations in 2012. - 2. Mennonite Church Canada is looking ahead with a task force created in 2012 to explore how we as a family of congregations can work together to achieve God's missional aspirations for the world.
