Pastor Patty's Ponderings: The Church of Brene Brown

Driving home from Edmonton one Sunday morning, I was listening to Brene Brown's Rising Strong Audio Book and Brene was talking about forgiveness in families. It felt like I was in church listening to a much needed sermon. (It is a relief to listen to someone else's sermon for a change!) I had just spent the week with family which always stirs up conflict as we try to help our mom move into assisted living. It's a drama that we have been at for years and that stirs up all kinds of anxiety from past conflicts. Our families of origin are our first rehearsals of conflict and forgiveness. It is much easier to rehearse the hurts than do the forgiving. My family needs to practice and rehearse forgiveness, time and time again in order to move forward.

While at the Church of Brene Brown on Hwy 16, I missed our church and the congregational singing that would have accompanied the sermon on forgiveness and sealed the deal, confirming the message in my soul. I prayed for our church and our church families in crisis. I prayed for our own relationships in church that need forgiveness and release in order to move forward in healthy ways. May God help us in this hard work of forgiveness in marriages, family and church this Easter season as we wait for spring (and Jesus) to come again.

Patty's Picks: Other Great New Movies

- *The Darkest Hour about Winston Churchill was better than the other movie titled Churchill, I thought. Powerful monologues.
- *Murder on the Orient Express was a modern rendition. I think I liked the older version better.
- *Loving Vincent was awesome. Van Gogh's art brilliantly rendered into moving pictures.
