November 11th is a time for tears over the death and destruction, and it is a time for resolve—to stand up for truth and Christ's way of peace.

## Part Two: Youth Ministry

We are blessed with a significant size and growing youth group, consisting of both senior and junior youth. With expanding reach, exposure and freedom, teenagers are confronted with numerous choices and pressures, and many are not healthy or life-giving. They not only need support and insight, but they also need positive, constructive opportunities. Adolescence is a pivotal time, and it can be a time for growth instead of regret. Parents need help; parents and teenagers need an intentional community committed to youth ministry to enable teens to thrive. To be sure, youth ministry is also about helping teenagers on the fringe; it is outreach, salvation ministry. Chances are the children of church members will get through these teen years okay, but some of their friends who are part of the youth group, may not. The challenge and size of our youth group is more than a volunteer can handle. We must give serious, prayerful consideration to how we can respond to this essential ministry. I believe we need a part time youth pastor, and God knows how that will happen. Let's find out what God knows.
