Minnesota radio host Garrison Keillor always began his show with "It's been a quiet week in Lake Wobegon where the women are strong, the men good looking and the children above average." I'll begin this pondering with "It's been a great month at Osler Mennonite Church where the elders are wonderful, the children and youth amazing, and everyone else, very cool."

If I knew interim ministry was going to be this fun, I would have done it a long time ago. It has felt like an easy transition, like sliding into old slippers. OMC is very motivated and high functioning which makes my job a lot easier. I've been impressed with the level of commitment and talent in the congregation. I feel privileged to walk alongside you for this next year. I see my job as encouraging and affirming what everyone is already doing, visiting and getting to know people more deeply, and preaching how I see God may be leading the congregation and me personally in this time of transition.
