Honoring our Forebears Abram G. Janzen June 8, 1920 – May 21, 2015

Abram Janzen lived long and he lived well.

As the Weisenamt for the Old Colony Church, he listened carefully before meting out measures tha assisted many who were in need. He was a mediator who could get disagreeing parties to come to peace. As a Sunday school teacher, he combined his love for history and his respect for *de Schreft*; his students respected him. Respect is earned, and Abram worked with Old Colony, Bergthaler, Conference, Mennonite Brethern, Rudnerweider, and other Mennonite groups. He was held in high esteem by all.

Abram and Gertrude held education in high regard and encouraged their children to pursue learning beyond the country schoolhouse. As a school trustee, Abram partnered with others to ensure that basic teaching and learning took place at Renfrew S.D. to the best of their abilities.

Abram appreciated history. He wrote about trying times and times of joy. He wrote about his experiences as a Weisenamt. He wrote a history of Aeltester Johann Loeppky and of his mother-in-law, Gertrude Bueckert Wiebe. He wrote about the history of Neuanlage Grace Mennonite Church. The Mennonite Historical Society of Saskatchewan has a collection of his papers.

Abram contributed stories used in Low German broadcasts by John D. Friesen and Ed Martens. He wrote hundreds of articles for *The Mennonitische Post* and *The Valley News*.

We have heard that Abram was not exactly an accomplished carpenter. If that is indeed true, may he be granted grace and may he be forgiven! Abram was a deeply spiritual man who believed his faith should be practically applied to life's many situations. He was a progressive Mennonite Christian.

When Alfred Lord Tennyson's close friend Hallam, died, he wrote this as a tribute: 'Tis better to have loved and died, than never to have loved at all." We believe Abram loved much.
