Pastor's Note

Lullabies and Raspberry Fuzz

My mother sang me lullabies. My father didn't. I wish my father had sung me lullabies, too, because then he might have know some of the sensual, holy joy of a child close to your body, a child drawing strength and giving hope. And, I might have learned at an earlier age that the God with a male image can be nurturing, too.

I recall a while ago, watching a friends put his child to bed with a CD of some lullabies. ``It's better than my croaky voice," he said. NO! Canned lullabies are half-hearted imitations of the truth, like canned raspberries eaten from a bowl that offers pale and onedimensional memories of a hot, buzzing, prickly path in the middle of summer. Canned raspberries don't even come close to savouring a ripe berry, in the sun and warm breeze, with thorn scratched arms. The tongue only renders part of the whole taste experience.

The sound of a lullaby is all you get on a recording. It may be better music, but it is music for the ears and not the soul. It is not music of a father's heartbeat, nor the warmth of a body, nor the smell of a woman or a man. It is not the sense of oneness with another, with creation, with the future, with a child. Likewise, canned raspberries have the smell of summer sterilized away--no leaves that rustle in the breeze, no blemishes, no thorns, no mosquitoes, and no inkling of eternity. It's food, but not spiritual nutrition.

God can't speak in words we hear; however, God speaks to us in life, in the sweetness of a freshly picked raspberry, in the taste of a mother's love and in the texture of a father's tenderness.

Carnal knowledge of a raspberry patch or of a baby put to sleep with lullabies is the pulse of holiness.
