

I'm writing to ask for your prayers. This week a grade 8 student of mine, Leandro, and his friend Ben (who is the same age but dropped out of school last year) were in a motorcycle accident. The accident was fatal for Ben, he died at the scene. Leandro is alive and recovering in the hospital, with no broken bones or internal bleeding, but very swollen and bruised. Though I'd only met Ben a couple times and did not know him, he was a good friend of many of my students, and was a student of Whitney's (my roommate) last year. The funeral was today, and it seemed the whole community was there. His doctors also allowed Leo to come back for it. Please pray for the family of Ben, which includes his parents, 5 brothers(the youngest who is in my grade 5 class) and 2 sisters, as they mourn the loss of their brother. Please pray for the students(especially the boys) who knew Ben and are trying to grasp and understand what has happened. Please pray also for Leandro and his family. As you may know, <u>registration is now open</u> for Elements of Justice: KAIROS InterGenerational Gathering 2013 on October 24-27 on gorgeous Squamish Nation Territory, north of Vancouver. Registrations need to be received before September 24 to guarantee your spot.

That's a short timeline now that the fall season has begun. We need your help to get the word out about this event! There is another email attached with more about the substance of the gathering; it can easily be forwarded. Please help us by passing it on to all your networks and contacts, particularly in western Canada. While this event is open to everyone, we will focus on the three regions west of Thunder Bay, Ontario.

All ages are welcome to this intergenerational gathering, including children. We are putting a special emphasis on invitations to young adults and welcome your help spreading the word in your colleges or other young adult gathering places.

Registration costs \$290 per person and includes the program, food from Thursday supper to Sunday lunch and shared accommodations in heated cabins with washrooms.
