"We felt God reminding us of the story in Joshua 5: 13-6:20 in which Joshua leads the Israelites at God's command to walk around the city of Jericho for 7 straight days, after which God leveled the walls at God's command to walk around the city of Jericho for 7 straight days, after which God leveled the walls for the Israelite army. Their faithfulness in displaying that battle belongs to God allowed God to display his control of a seemingly impossible situation. So, we felt that we should do the same thing, ignoring everything in relation to our project for 7 days, and simply walking around the Bontleng site for those 7 days, dedicating the site to God and the project to his will, and asking him to tear down the spiritual walls surrounding all of the sites in question."

Mennonite Church Canada Young Church leaders, Nathan and Taryn Dirks, work in Gaborone, Botswana, with youth and young adults from local African Initiated Churches (AICs). Their focus is on community development and Bible teaching. Through their local partnerships they volunteer in local prisons, a school for special needs children, and coordinate development projects in urban agriculture and sports. They emphasize the local sustainability of these projects through the efforts of their young adult AIC partners.

Reflections on "Cow Sunday", September 27, 2015

Impressions from OMC Dairy Slideshow:

- how many babies were in their portable cribs in the barn while both parents milked
- how milk was dumped in the fields during the milk strike
- how many prize-winning cows were bred
- how many dairy jobs were created for youth, unemployed and guys out of prison

People appreciated remembering our agricultural history and learning how faith and work come together for those in dairy farming. One person commented, "being relatively new to the church, it was good to hear from people who don't ordinarily share and learn why they chose farming and how faith intersects with work in a real way." I think people feel a greater connection now. And isn't that what Sunday morning is all about?
