Pastor's Note:

Regardless if we are ready or not, September reminds us that it is time to change gears. We've been in summer mode, which has its own cadence and focus; however, school is resuming, harvest beckons, the sun is hiding more and the birds will be filling the skies. All serve to prompt us to return to our "normal" schedule and pace. Still, the shift is not automatic; we must decide what is normal, what will be our priorities and what values we be our new focus. September is a time of assessment, evaluation and change.

In a manual transmission, the clutch pedal must be pushed to disengage the clutch. In essence, to change gears, release / letting go is required. Parting with old patterns means letting go. The next step is selecting the gear to engage: deciding and putting in place our new means of movement. Finally, the clutch is allowed to grab and hold the new gear, and life goes on. In transition, we are letting go and deciding what new to hold onto. It is best to choose wisely and carefully. If not, then gears will grind and/or our choices may not take us how we need to go.

Our options include our church involvement and our spiritual wellbeing. And interestingly, letting go is part of our spiritual growth. Letting go of "stuff" and temporal things allows us to grab onto God and God to hold onto us. This releasing also applies to our finances. We grow spiritually when we give to God with no strings attached. Most people continue to donate (invest) through the summer, yet giving tends to decrease. Consider the patterns and values that will form your life in the coming months, and in that process, allow letting go / giving to free you to engage in the love and grace of God, too.

RECIPE

Here is a recipe for one of the delicious desserts enjoyed at June's ladies "Heart to Heart" get-together, thanks to Loretta Sawatzky.

Lemon Squares

Crust:

1 c. butter

2 c. flour

1/2 c. sugar

Pinch of salt

Mix and press on the bottom of a 9' x 13' pan. Bake at 350 for 16 minutes

Filling:

4 eggs

1/3 c. lemon juice (I squeeze fresh lemons)

1 tsp. lemon zest

2 c. sugar

1/4 c. flour

1 tsp. baking powder

Beat eggs well. Add all other ingredients and mix well. Pour on warm baked crust.

Bake at 350 for 17-22 minutes. Cut edges immediately.

Cool. Sprinkle with icing sugar
